# Registration and Opening Sessions

#### **Check-in Registration**

- Check-In for the Summer Symposium is at the Student Recreation and Wellness Center in the 3-Court Gym. You will pick up your credential, wristband, and meal card.
  - o <u>If you arrive during the registration times listed below</u>, first report to registration.
  - Any campers who arrive outside of registration times should report straight to their dorms.
- The Summer Symposium Registration room will be open during the following times. Campers who
  are attending both the Leadership Weekend and the weeklong camp only need to check in on
  Saturday June 22:

#### **Identification Procedure**

Music for All will provide each camper with a name badge and colored wristband. Please be prepared
to show some form of identification at registration. Campers must carry their room key, name badge,
wristband, and meal card.

# Housing Information and Dorm Check-in/Out

#### Housing Assignments

- All campers will receive an email with housing confirmation the week prior to your arrival. This includes residence hall location, arrival/departure dates, and roommate assignment.
- Roommate requests will only be honored if both parties request each other and have the same arrival and departure dates. If you have not already, you may request a roommate by emailing <a href="mailto:symposium@musicforall.org">symposium@musicforall.org</a>
  - O There is a \$20 change fee for requests made after June 10

#### Early Arrival

- Additional room and board for campers that must arrive to campus early is available.
- Housing is available on both Friday night, June 21 before Leadership Weekend AND Sunday night, June 23, before the full camp week.
- If you have not indicated you need additional room and board already, you may do so by emailing <a href="mailto:symposium@musicforall.org">symposium@musicforall.org</a>
  - O There is a \$20 change fee for changes made after June 10

#### Early Departure

- If a camper must depart early any day/time before their final performance on Saturday, June 29, an Early Departure form must be completed by the student's parent/guardian **prior** to arriving at camp.

- Leave all linens in rooms and all doors unlocked and carry any trash from your room to trash bins located on each floor.

#### **Shuttle Information**

• For campers who are flying to Summer Symposium, Music for All offers a shuttle service to and from the Indianapolis International Airport at the beginning and conclusion of camp. Shuttles are \$50 per camper for a one-way ride, or \$100 round trip. Shuttle Reservations can be arranged through your UltraCamp Account by selecting and completing the Air Travel Information Form that applies to your shuttle needs. #### Weather and Dorm Information

- June weather in Indiana is often unpredictable. Historical averages range from 60° F 90° F. Typically the week includes high humidity.
- All Ball State University Residence Halls will have air conditioning for the duration of camp. The rooms tend to be cool at night.

#### **Internet Access**

• Ball State offers a wireless network across campus for its guests. The wireless network name is bsuguest. There is no login or password needed for this network. As this is a guest network, note that connection speed and strength may vary between buildings around campus.

# **Symposium Procedures**

#### **SWAG** Team

- The Summer Symposium SWAG Team serves as counselors in the dorms and attends all rehearsals and concerts with their assigned groups of students. SWAG Team members are selected through a rigorous application process and background check, and many are young professionals who volunteer their time and talents. Most SWAGS are alumni of the Summer Symposium. SWAGs want to give back to the campers of the Summer Symposium by helping create the same experiences that had such a positive impact on their own lives.
- The SWAG Team serves as the primary source of student supervision, and all students must comply with the rules and guidelines set forth by the SWAG Team during Summer Symposium.

#### General Camp Rules

- Students are expected to attend all rehearsals and evening events. Attendance will be taken as each class starts and at the nightly floor meeting in your dorm. If you are not present and are not with the nurse, an immediate search of the campus will commence.
- You are expected to follow the rules and timelines regarding appropriate behavior, room assignments, and curfews.
- All medication must be registered with the camp nurse during the check-in process.
- Every Music for All event observes a TOBACCO FREE policy. Tobacco includes but is not limited to cigarettes, vape pens, cigars, pipes, water pipes (hookah), electronic cigarettes, smokeless tobacco, and chewing tobacco are not to be consumed or possessed by any student camper throughout the duration of camp.
- The possession or use of alcohol and/or illegal drugs is STRICTLY PROHIBITED and will result in immediate dismissal at the student/family's expense.
- You may not leave campus for any reason without having made prior, specific arrangements with the Music for All staff.
- Students (other than commuters) that drive to Ball State University must turn in their keys at Check-In and will not be allowed to drive anywhere during their stay.
- Campers assume all financial responsibility for damage occurring in a campus building or on campus grounds due to their own negligence.
- Cell phones must be silenced during all rehearsals, concerts, and performances.

#### **University Housing Policies**

- No open flames.
- Doors should not be propped open.
- Lofted furniture should remain lofted and should not block access to any windows or doors.
- Furniture should not be dismantled or removed from its designated space.
- Students are responsible for disposal of their trash. Trash/recycling rooms are located on every floor.
- Markings or postings on exterior surfaces of residence halls and complexes are prohibited; this includes writing messages on sidewalks using chalk or tape.
- Campers may only post items or messages on the provided bulletin board affixed to their door.
- Campers are held financially responsible for any property damage resulting from the violation of any of the above policies or general negligence.

# THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE PROHIBITED AND WILL BE CONFISCATED BY MUSIC FOR ALL/BSU POLICE DEPARTMENT

- Tobacco
- Alcohol
- Scooters
- Bicycles
- Illegal Drugs
- Coffee Makers
- Weapons (non-performance)

Any infraction of the above rules could result in early dismissal from the camp. Parents will be responsible for transportation costs if a child is dismissed early from camp.
